Mr Greacen said that he believed the award could give the hotel a platform to continue to grow, and added that his push for new apprentices was part of a concerted effort to attract more local staff.

"We want to continue to grow and be a nice place for people to visit locally. Somer-ton's a very good town, and it deserves this.
